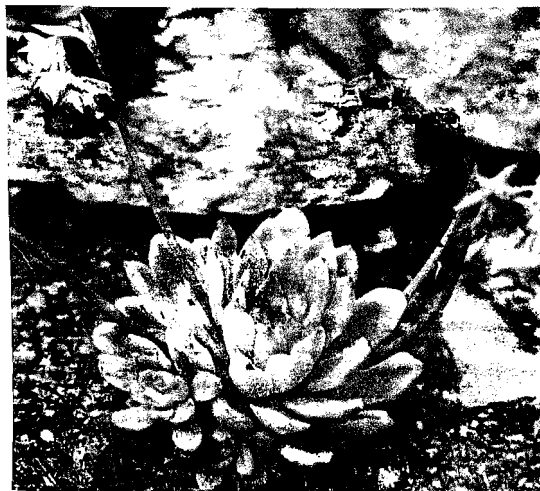
President's Message

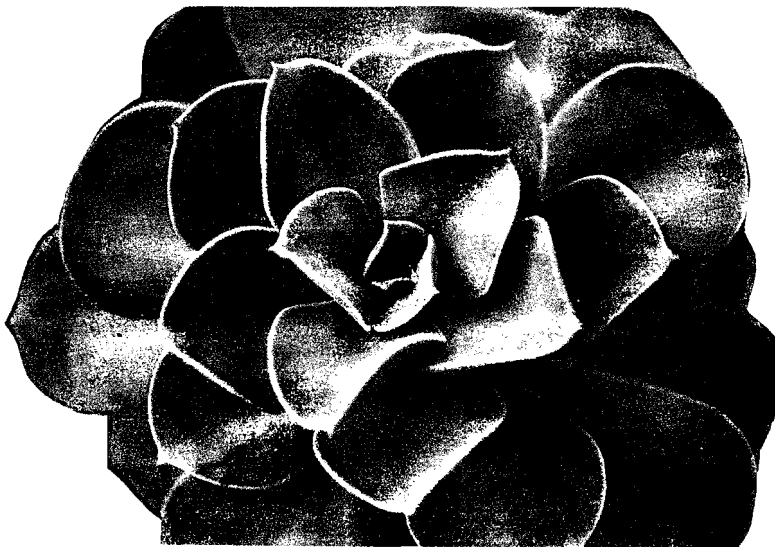


Echeveria pulidonis

SACXS General Meeting Minutes – August 18, 2004

This was the final meeting for our president Ann Dickey and the 2003-2004 officers. Claude Townsend reminded us about the TACSS 2004 Fall Seminar, which will take place on September 18 and 19 at the Best Western Sunday House in Kerrville, and encouraged SACXS members to attend. Ann Dickey recognized all of the outgoing officers and directors and thanked them for their service. She then gave each new officer a certificate describing his or her respective duties. Ann said that it had been her pleasure to serve as president for two years, and that she had really enjoyed it. Ann noted that Lucile Lively had initially talked her into accepting the nomination, and that Lucile had been a wonderful resource and source of support. Ann Dickey then received a certificate of appreciation, a thank you card from the members, and a gift certificate. Bobby Crabb, vice president and director of programs, gave the evening's presentation, which was titled "An Evening with Del Wenigar". This was a thoroughly researched historical perspective of the academic and horticultural accomplishments of Del Wenigar, a former professor of Biology at Our Lady of the Lake University. Bobby also provided a review of several species of native Texas cacti. Of note, several of the Latin names of these species have changed. However, Dr Wenigar's descriptions of cacti are still some of the most useful available to modern cactophiles. Several current members reminisced about their memories of Professor Wenigar. After the presentation, Bobby conducted the plant auction. Ann Dickey pulled numbers for the plant raffle. The meeting adjourned with everyone in agreement that it had been both informative and enjoyable.

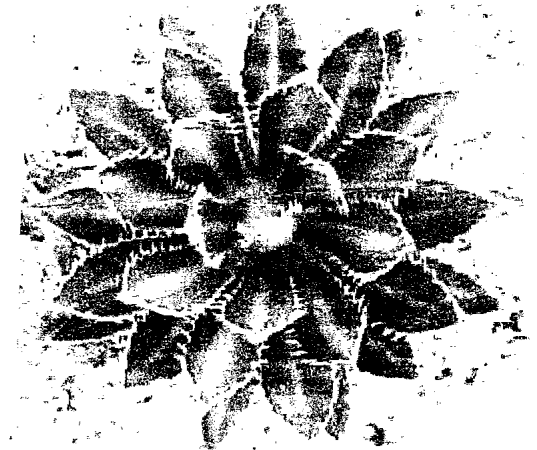
